Newly elected Council

In September Glovertown elected a new Council with five new members. Over the past two months these new members have been getting familiar with the workings of Council and the issues that have recently come up. Most have taken advantage of the training session for new Councillors sponsored by the Dept. of Municipal Affairs and look forward to providing four years of good service to the Town.

New Clinic officially opened



On November 15, the new Medical Clinic was officially opened by the Provincial Dept. of Health and Central Health. We have a facility we can all really feel proud of. With 1500 extra square feet of space, you will find the building much more user friendly. It's a good sign that Government will maintain our current health services well into the future.

Capital Works Budget

Each year at this time, Council has to submit to Government its Capital Works request for the coming year. The funding for the work is shared 90% Government and 10% Town. Last year Government saw fit to fund work on Penney's Brook Road. Due to the lateness of the season, this work will be done in the spring. This year council has submitted the following priorities:

1. Generator backup system for Station Road to ensure water flows in the event of power outage.
2. Upgrades to the water intake system at the Nor' West Pond water supply to reduce the risk of freeze-up in the early winter.
3. Water treatment study to determine the work necessary to improve water quality.
4. Street Paving of various areas of Town

(As a stopgap, until we get the proper generator in place, Council has approved work to be done at the Station Road Pump House to accommodate an existing generator we have. This will give some relief in case of power outages.)



Town Centre Project

Council has received funding from the Federal (\$24,000.00) and Provincial (\$24,000.00) Governments to hire a consultant to develop a plan to redevelop a central area of Town. With the participation of the Town (\$10,000.00) and Business community (\$3000.00), we feel we will have a plan to draw visitors and tourists to this central area and promote all the services in the Town. The Consultant should be hired early in January 2014 with the final plan ready by June 2014.

Clean-up Week success

This fall's Clean-up Week went very well. We thank everyone for their cooperation with following the guidelines and making the clean-up run smoothly. The two clean-ups per year seem to reduce the amount of garbage at clean-up time.
